## *Our Projects and Activities*

### **1. Karnataka Child Rights Observatory**



Karnataka Child Rights Observatory (KCRO) was launched in 2008, with the support and partnership of UNICEF, Hyderabad and with CRT as the secretariat. KCRO is an advocacy forum for the advancement of child rights in Karnataka, they initiate lobbying, training and research on issues concerned with child rights. KCRO is run by a network of NGOs, academics and individuals working in the field. It was set up as an omnibus project with a number of sub-projects that together converge to provide Evidence based advocacy, working with key stakeholders and working with media followed by consultations, daily news digest, working with legislators, election advocacy, data compilations and presentations for the Alternative CRC review, and other issues.

#### **1.1 District & State Child Rights Parliament 2018**

In an effort to promote child participation, Child Rights Parliament was initiated by KCRO in 2006. The whole process has strengthened the concept of informed Child Participation. Every year around 1500 children take part in the process from all the 30 districts of the state. In the recent developments NGOs, District Child Protection Units, Education Department and CBOs are taking interest in organising the CRP. The CRP has two parts. One to provide information on child rights, NPC and the status of children (statistical and case studies) in the state along with the performance of their respective MLAs in the Assembly and the second part is to get opinion and issues from the children to be discussed at district and state level to set them right. The process raises a lot of questions about child survival, protection, development and participation. The issues raised at district level are brought to Bengaluru to be consolidated and discussed with the Govt representatives.

This year District CRPs were held in 23 districts of the state with the participation on 1150 children & Child representatives from the districts who were selected by the children in DCRP took part in State CRP 2018 and it was on 17-20 November at ISI, Bengaluru. 60 children and 35 adults took part in the state meet and had discussions. Finally they finalised their demands.



## 1.2 Launch of KCRO activities 2018-20 and Capacity Building programme on Early Child Care and Development (ECCD)

The 2018-20 activities of KCRO were launched on 21-11-2018 at ISI, Bengaluru. 25 KCRO network members from various parts of the state participated in the launch. Mr.Vasudeva Sharma welcomed the participants and briefed about the objectives of the programme. The programme was inaugurated by releasing campaign material **“For Sustainable Development pay attention to adolescents”**. The campaign material was released by Ms.Meital Rusdia, Chief of Field Office, UNICEF Field Office for Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and Karnataka; Mr.ProsunSen, Advocacy and Communication Specialist, UNICEF field office for Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and Karnataka; Dr.Padmini, Trustee, CRT and Mr.Vasudeva Sharma, State Convener, KCRO. Mr.Raghavendra from Bellary, Mr. G.N. Simha, Bagalkote and Mr.RennyD’souza, Mangalore shared their experience of conducting KCRO programmes in their districts and they also shared their learning from the programmes they conducted.

In the capacity building programme on Early Child Care and Development ECCD, Dr.Madhumathi introduced concept of ECCD and its relevance; Dr. Tara explained about the Importance of infant and young child Health and Nutrition - problems and strategies; Dr.Anuradha briefed about parenting skills - child psychology; Mr.Ramanjaneya explained their experience in working with the AWCs in Bellary District and Dr.Padmini explained about

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## 1.3 Divisional Level Consultation on ECCD

To organise divisional level consultations we collaborated with network organisation in 3 divisions of the state: Smt. V.H.D. Central Institute of Home Science, Margadarshi, CDF and Human Development, Department of Food Science and Nutrition, Mysore University. The consultation mainly dealt with principles of ECCD, safe environment of ECCD, concept of 1000 days, parenting, quality child care etc were discussed. NGO representatives, department officials, AWWs, University students and professors took part in the consultation.

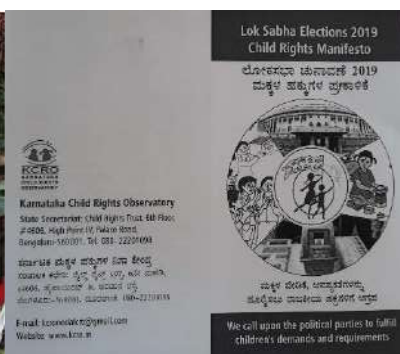
#### 1.4. Election Advocacy for Vidhana Sabha and Lok Sabha Elections



KCRO had organised a one day consultation to develop 'Child Rights Manifesto' for 2018 Karnataka Assembly election on 19th January 2018. 35 representatives from 19 NGOs participated in the consultation.

Similar kind of consultation was held on 5<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup>, February ,2019 for Lok Sabha elections, 40 NGO representatives participated in the consultation.

In both the consultations certain demands were developed on the basis of the children's situation. A small booklet was prepared with the demands, situation and explanation and the same was taken to the political parties to be included in the Party Manifestos.





### 1.5 Are There Children in VidhanaSoudha

During this year only 18 Days of session from June 2018 to Feb 2018 was held in Karnataka assembly. During this period a total of 6158 questions were raised in the assembly sessions out of which 4048 questions in lower house and 2110 in upper house. The tabulation of these questions for analysis is going on.

### 1.6 Child in News



Scanning daily newspapers (10) for child centered news, listing and disseminating to news users for advocacy, policy, campaign, education, research, further dissemination, etc. is an ongoing activity reaching out to the network members since 2008

The service is getting good response from NGO members, media personnel, researchers and academicians as it helps them to keep themselves updated. Trainers, facilitators, and people who conduct workshops also have regarded that a daily update equip them to use the statistics, reports and some commentaries to bring relevance in their sessions.

### 1.7 Karnataka State Legislators' Forum for Child Rights (KSLFCR)



Due to changing political situations the much awaited meeting with the legislators in an organised manner could not be conducted during the year. However, several rounds of discussions were held with the Speakers of the lower house and Chairmans of the Upper house were conducted to take the mission forward.

But as per the plans child centric questions are shared with the legislators of both the houses to be raised on the floor of the houses.

## 2. RTE TaskForce - Karnataka



The RTE Task Force - Karnataka is a response to the crisis confusing situation created at the time of RTE Act implementation in the year 2011 in the state. Prior to this, i.e., immediately the Act was passed CRT and its network organizations were

active in pressurising the Government to pass the RTE Model Rules and was lobbying with the Karnataka Government for developing and implementing the RTE Karnataka Rules. CRT team members were also part of the review committee of the draft Rules with the Govt. Currently the RTE Task Force as a project is working as an advocacy and resource group on RTE issues in Karnataka. It is catering to support the needs of NGOs, local networks, schools, Govt., and individual parents who require information and clarifications on various issues related to RTE implementation. The RTE Task Force is assisting by giving explanations on RTE Act, state rules and the various circulars issued by the Govt. from time to time.


**2.1 Shidlaghatta field project:** RTE TaskForce Karnataka is also working in Shidlaghatta, Chikkaballapura district to get a field knowledge on the RTE Act 2009 implementation and the questions that it is raising. Apart from the RTE Act implementation the TaskForce is working with GPs, Schools, CBOs and other NGOs in providing network services to them all and also to improve the knowledge of the teachers about the various provisions of the RTE Act. During the year RTE TaskForce successfully facilitated in organising Child Rights Grama Sabhas in 28 GPs. Child Rights Clubs members from 50 schools participation. This advocacy exercise has given the expected dividends in terms of improving several school concerned infrastructure and related issues. Issues pertaining to school drop outs, toilets, child marriage and child labour has been discussed demanding the GP and the concerned authorities including the education dept to take action.

Child Rights clubs have been formed in all 55 schools and they have conducted 2 rounds of meetings on child rights, Child Rights Grama Sabha (CRGS) and RTE. In all meetings 13 children + 1 teacher participated in each school level. From these 51 schools 550 Child Rights Clubs Children actively Participated in Child Rights Grama Sabhas



Along with the above the following are some of the titbits achieved during the year:

- 12 schools selected for developing into model schools and primary level meetings were conducted with SDMC, Teacher and children.

- 50 Bala Vikasa Samithis were formed/activated at ICDS Anganawadis.
  - Process started to build the BVS members capacity to monitor and support the ICDS services.
  - 55 school libraries upgraded with GROWBY methodology.
  - In all 55 schools and 50 Anganwadis Child Protection Policy, Food Safety measures awareness were conducted and implemented.
  - In 11 high schools around 500+ children were involved in Career Guidance and Counselling process.
  - A new initiative of School and Anganwadi joint meetings was conducted at 35 villages to build good network among the teachers, SDMCs and Bala Vikasa Samithi members to promote mutual cooperation and children healthy transition

## Launch of Helpline for parents on RTE Sec. 12.1.c (Nov. 2018)

In Collaboration with Indus Action, New Delhi a new initiative with a free helpline was launched to reach out to the Art. 12.1.c RTE Act aspirants. Mr. Mariswamy, then Acting Chairperson of KSCPCR inaugurated the helpline 080 30474949. As per the plan, anyone who is interested in RTE Sec. 12.1.c or 25% is invited to give a missed call to this number. On receipt of the call the volunteers would return a call and would give information regarding 25% reservation. From Nov. 2018 to Jan 2019 (within 3 months) this helpline received a little over than 70,000 calls. Out of which, 15,000 are from different districts like Dharwad, Mysore, Mandya, Chikkaballapura, Chitradurga, and Thumkurapart from Bengaluru and surrounding districts. The return calls to parents are being made by a team of 10 volunteers and while discussing with around 30,000 callers, the process has identified close to 20,000 eligible children for the benefit of RTE 25%.



## 2.3 RTE TaskForce Bengaluru

- On invitation visited "Muslim Youth Association" and gave inputs on RTE Act norms for Madarasas in Bengaluru
- This year received 42 complaints from parents - fee, discrimination, corporal punishment and other issues, where 36 of the complaints are resolved.





- RTE TaskForce and other partners have decided to create a network among CCIs to give them regular inputs and providing them legal help.
- RTE TaskForce along with Indus Action visited many child care institutions in Bengaluru to give inputs about RTE. We found out that many CCI's don't know about child rights, education, protection of children, etc. Many CCIs need help in this regard. So RTE TaskForce and Indus Action has decided to create network among CCIs to give them regular inputs and providing them legal help. In this regard on 20th March 2019 RTE TaskForce with other network members is organizing consultation at Mahaveer Jain college.



When the state govt decided to amend the RTE rules, RTE TaskForce opposed this in all possible forums and platforms. The amendments were not in favour of children and poor parents. While making such an amendment there was no consultation with parents, education experts or activists. RTE TaskForce organized a consultation with the parents and teachers and listed 10 recommendations and submitted a memorandum to chief secretary.

### 3. Bengaluru ChildLine 1098 Nodal Agency



Child Rights Trust is functioning as ChildLine 1098 Nodal Agency since 2007. The objectives of the nodal agency of ChildLine 1098 is to coordinate with the ChildLine 1098 collaborative organisations (APSA, BOSCO and SATHI) and with various other stakeholders – Govt. departments such as Police, DWCD, Education, Health, social Welfare, Railways and other NGOs to provide justice to children in distress.

CRT has continued its responsibility of coordinating the ChildLine (Toll free Child Helpline Telephone no. 1098) activities in Bangalore as a City Nodal, by the ChildLine India Foundation a project under Ministry of Women and Children, GOI. As a nodal agency CRT has undertaken and organized many capacity building trainings, workshops and awareness programmes along with collaborative agencies such as police, teachers, students, NGOs and media at various levels. ChildLine also gets involved in rescuing children from various working situations, from railway stations, bus stands and those who are begging in the streets.

With the advocacy conducted by ChildLine Nodal Agency a special Circular from Labour department could be got directing the officers to support the ChildLine in child labour rescue. This letter is of great help to the team members in rescue operations.

#### 4. Sustainable Menstrual Hygiene Management

A new initiative to empower the adolescent girls and rural women CRT has embarked into a new initiative joining hands with RIM - Rejuvenate India Movement. The SMHM is reaching out to menstruating girls in schools and in the community educating them about the much needed cleanliness and hygiene methods to be adopted during their cycles. This also indirectly advocating with the schools, communities and the local Govt to provide clean toilets to girls in every possible place and also motivating them make use of the same.

In the year the following activities were conducted as part of the programme

- Conducted World SMHM Day on 28th May 2018 at Shidlaghatta
- 500+ Adolescent Girls have switched to Reusable Pads.
- 5 ANMs, 35 ASHA workers have switched to Menstrual Cups.
- 20 Anganawadi Workers have switched to Menstrual Cups.
- In all the 10 High Schools (RIM working area) the burning and throwing away of disposable Sanitary Pads will come down.
- 36 SHG womens are trained to make their own Pads.





- Network was done with other community CBOs and NGOs like SKDRDP and MahilaSamakhya to promote SMHM concept at larger level.
- 22 girls who had completed SSLC, but in the verge of dropping out got scholarship to continue their education.



## 5. IMAGE-Initiatives for Married Adolescent Girls' Empowerment)

Our work in the field of SRHR-Sexual and Reproductive Health Rights and prevention of child marriages in collaboration with consortium members located in various districts of Karnataka has transformed into IMAGE. With the prior experience of understanding the issue and developing a network around the issue, the project intends to build the capacities of the network members on facilitating trainings and discussions with field team, married adolescent girls and the Govt. This involves working with six groups in five districts in the areas of research, leadership development, communications and interacting with media and Govt.

- TOT on Counseling- Methods and Techniques in the background of prevention of Child marriages and interventions with EMGs, NIMHANS, Bengaluru-18-20 Dec 2018.

## 5.1 State Level Conference on Rights of Girl Child with respect to Prevention of Child Marriages and EMG issues

Hotel Vijaya and VikasaSoudha, 28-29 Dec 2018. Collaborators: IMAGE partners, KSCPCR, THP, Childline. 180 activists participated. Raised the issues largely pertaining to married adolescent girls and demanded the action from Govt.



## 5.2 Advocacy meeting with DWCD

One of the objectives of IMAGE is to advocate with the Govt to identify the issues pertaining to EMGs. To fulfil this several rounds of discussions were held with the Directorate of Women and Child Development and its Prohibition of Child Marriages Cell, concerned minister and the Principal Secretary to DWCD. All these are still in initial stages and we are expecting much time to be obtained in the coming years to put across the issues.



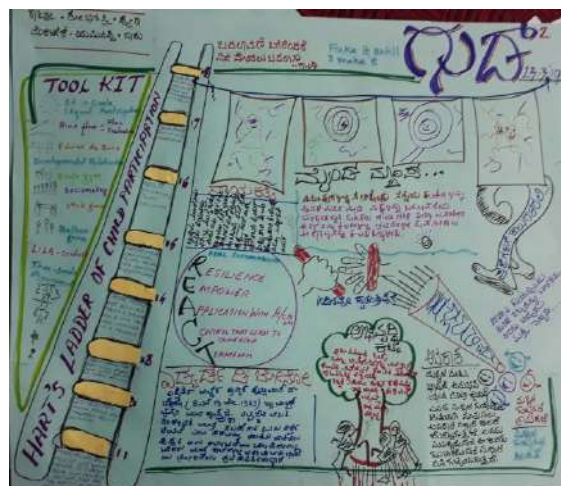
In the meanwhile with media support several stories about the plight of the EMGs has been published in several newspapers reaching out to the Govt.

TOI, Deccan Herald have written several stories about the issue. .



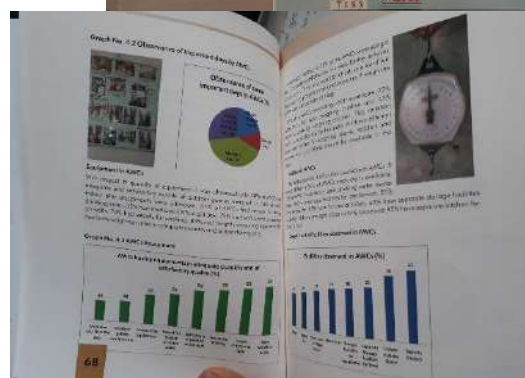
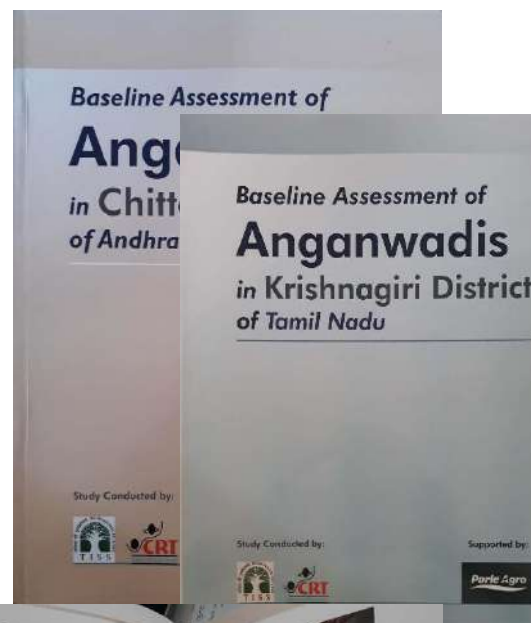
## 6. GOOD – Getting Out of Devadasi System

Children GOOD project started on March 2019. In the first month several rounds of interactions and discussions happened with Tdh-NL, in order to get clarity about the project. End of March from CRT Mr.Vasudeva Sharma N.V Venkatesh T. and Rajashree attended the Consultation regarding GOOD project organized at Hospet. When we received the clarity about this project Mr.Vasudev Sharma and Venkatesh visited the partners of Belagavi and Bagalkote districts to understand the situation. Now we are preparing the Modules and Manuals for the project.

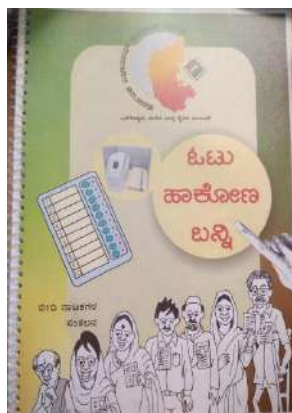
Recently with the support of TdH NL computer has been provided to the group and classes have started. The group has also begun drawing classes to reach out to the members.



## 9. Systematic Voter Education and Electoral Participation - SVEEP



On the invitation of the Chief Electoral Officers of Karnataka Circle, CRT along with other network organisations the responsibility to develop street and puppet plays as a communication material for SVEEP. The experience great one as we can always adopt the learning to child rights campaigns. could conduct workshops with authors and develop about 15 plays (plays and puppet plays) on voter education. The book has been published both in Kannada and English by the Chief Electoral Office, Karnataka.

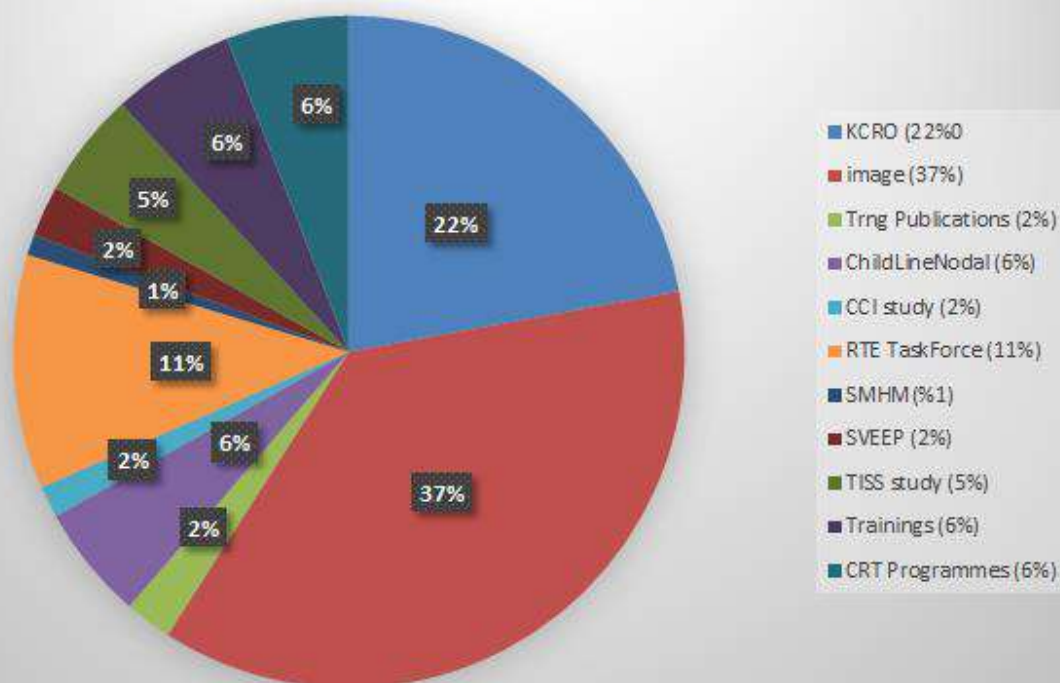
